

Sick and Illness Policy

Early support and the Experimental Education Unit (EEU) follows both the University of Washington Health and Safety Guidelines in addition to Seattle King County Public Health Department Guidelines

Home Visits

- If anyone in the household (child, caregiver) is sick, then any scheduled sessions will be cancelled
- Any sick individuals must be 24-hour symptom free without medication before resuming any home visits or sessions

Toddler Time

- If the child or accompanying caregiver are sick, then they must stay home from school
- Any sick individuals must be 24-hour symptom free without medication before attending Toddler Time

Definitions of Illness/Sickness

If you or your child have one or more of these **NEW**, changed, or worsening symptoms:

- Fever (100.4 degrees F) or chills
- Shortness of breath or difficult breathing
- Muscle or body aches
- Loss of taste or smell
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
- Headache
- Fatigue
- Sore Throat
- Cough

If you or your child tests positive for COVID:

- Adults can leave isolation if you have had no fever within the past 24 hours (without medication) and symptoms have improved. Adults are encouraged to then mask and resume normal activities 10 days after symptoms started
- Children must isolate for 10 days (if unable to wear a mask), after which either home visits or Toddler Time sessions may continue
